Dear Parents

It is with sadness that I inform you that **Mrs Gay Thom**, music teacher at Waterford Kamhlaba from 1990 to November 2003, died over the Easter Weekend after a long fight against cancer. A Memorial Service for her is to be held at 3pm on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> March, at All Saints Cathedral. The Choir is scheduled to sing at the Memorial Service and most members of staff will be present. Because of this, formal lessons will end at 2.40pm, with those classes with lessons later in the afternoon being set assignments by their teachers. The bus service will run at the usual times.

This has been an intensive three-week period in the music department, starting with a visit from **British musician Roo Piggot** (who worked with students during the week starting 21<sup>st</sup> March). Last week the department hosted Moroccan percussionist Khalid Kouhen. His visit culminated with a wonderful performance to the whole school last Friday by Khalid and Mark Bradshaw (Head of Music at WK).

**The Theatre Arts Department** remains busy. The IB2 Individual Project Festival started last Friday and finishes this Wednesday evening. At the same time, preparations continue for the Form 1 to 5 production 'S'gubhu'. 'S'gubhu' is designed as a touring production for term 2, but a preliminary performance for Waterford students will take place during the last week of term. (Parents are scheduled to be invited to a performance at House on Fire next term.)

I wish to congratulate the **cricket team** for winning the inter-schools cricket festival over the weekend.
