

Waterford Kamhlaba's International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) and International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) Results

IBDP Results:

Waterford Kamhlaba's IB Class of 2020 maintained the school's impressive performance in the International Baccalaureate Diploma examinations.

In 2020 students did not write examinations but were assessed according to coursework submitted to and marked by IB's examiners. Out of the 114 students who submitted their coursework, 94% were awarded a diploma, compared to the previous year's 92%. Impressively, 17% of the students achieved a score of 36 points and above and 28% of them achieved a Bilingual Diploma, compared to 12.4% and 27.4% in the 2019 class respectively. The highest grade in 2020 was 42 (highest possible score is 45 points). In an unprecedented year full of adversity and challenges unforeseen, we are delighted with the achievements of our students.

For the class of 2020, the focus now switches to university applications. Already, some students have been offered places in tertiary institutions in the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom and South Africa.

IGCSE Results:

Waterford Kamhlaba's Form Five students achieved outstanding IGCSE results in the 2020 examinations.

The College is delighted to be able to congratulate the Form 5 Class of 2020 on truly impressive IGCSE results. There were 75 students who sat for the examinations of which 91.2% achieved 5 or more A* - C grades. 49.4% of the students achieved 5 or more A or A* grades which really is quite remarkable.

The college's principal, Patricia Angoy, applauded the students and teachers for this achievement. "We have historically good results in IGCSE and IBDP exams for 2020. Our students and staff have worked hard and many of our students exceeded our expectations and those they had of themselves. Congratulations to the students and we wish them more success in their future endeavors. We also thank the school's Governing Council, parents, alumni and donors for their continued support to Waterford Kamhlaba, without whom we would not have achieved these results," she said.
